We believe that an electoral victory is a sacred responsibility to serve the people.

This mandate, therefore, belongs to the people of Zambia, to strengthen our democracy, to expand opportunities for all, and to build a more prosperous, united, and resilient nation. It is a mandate to grow Zambia.

Fellow citizens, we acknowledge the supremacy of the Almighty God over this nation. We give thanks to the Zambian people.

You came forward to exercise your constitutional right to vote. You stood patiently in queues, made your choices and once again demonstrated your faith in democracy.

Democracy does not require us to agree on everything. It requires us to respect one another even when we disagree.

Whatever our political choices, we remain one people, bound together by Zambia, and a common destiny.

Fellow citizens, I thank my beloved wife, Mutinta, our children and our wider family for their sacrifice, patience, encouragement and unfailing support.

To the members of the United Party for National Development, our alliance partners, campaign teams, foot soldiers, volunteers and supporters across our country: we thank you. We honour you!

Your sacrifice, diligence, hard work, and faith in the Zambia we seek to build together have brought us to this moment.

We celebrate this achievement with dignity and humility. There must be no taunting, no provocation and no humiliation of those who voted differently.

The person who voted against us is not our enemy. He is our brother. She is our sister. They are fellow Zambians.

In victory, let us show the character of the Zambia we are building.

Your Excellencies, distinguished guests, we thank the Heads of State and Government, foreign dignitaries, representatives of international and regional organisations, members of the diplomatic corps and all distinguished guests who have joined us.

Your presence is a profound expression of friendship, solidarity and partnership with the Government and people of Zambia.

We value your friendship and look forward to deepening our cooperation for the mutual benefit of our peoples.

The Record of Our First Term

Fellow citizens, the trust that you have renewed is also a responsibility to build upon the foundations we have laid together.

During our first term, we worked to stabilise and revitalise our economy.

Economic growth improved. Our external debt was successfully restructured. Our international reserves have reached their highest level of all time. Inflation reduced to the lowest level in 8 years. Investor confidence has improved, the Kwacha has been stabilised. Free education became a reality and is now protected by law.

2.6 million additional children have since returned to school.

Access to quality healthcare has improved.

Through the enhanced Constituency Development Fund, resources are reaching communities and local development priorities are being addressed.

Our social protection programmes are reaching more of our vulnerable citizens.

The rule of law has been restored. There can be no sustainable development without peace, security, and stability.

We have enhanced access to information and widened participation in governance.

We introduced the proportional representation system — a landmark reform that has enhanced the participation of women, young people and persons with disabilities in the National Assembly and local authorities.

We have also decentralised functions, resources and decision-making to local authorities, bringing government closer to the people.

Yes, a lot has been achieved in our first mandate but we know that there is still much more work to be done.

From Stabilisation to Growth

Fellow citizens, we know that for many families, the cost of living has remained challenging, and that the benefits of our stabilisation have not yet been felt at every level. We hear you.

Yes, stability of our national balance sheet must continue to flow to every household.

Having done the heavy lifting in our first term, the next five years is about growth, expansion, opportunity and prosperity.

This is what the Grow Zambia agenda means in practice: growth, expansion and opportunity for every Zambian.

Going forward, our focus is clear: we build on the economic stabilisation platform to economic expansion.

No matter how good-hearted one may be, you cannot share poverty. We must grow the economy so that there is more for every Zambian to share and to redistribute.

Working with the private sector we will continue with an even more ambitious reform agenda.

For us, reforms have delivered — and will continue to deliver — positive results for our people.

We will grow and diversify our mining, agriculture, tourism and energy sectors, among others.

We will accelerate infrastructure development and industrial transformation through reforming institutions that have stood in the way of our country's growth for too long.

This is anchored by our flagship Grow Zambia agenda, 10-10-5-3-3-1-1-1: 10 million tonnes of maize, 10,000 megawatts of electricity, 5 million tourists, 3 million tonnes of copper, 3 million tonnes of soya, 1 million tonnes of wheat, 1 million tonnes of sugar, and 1 billion USD in beef export revenue.

Through this agenda, we will more than double the size of our economy, to create more jobs, business opportunities and treasury revenue for further investment and supporting our society, especially the needy and most vulnerable.

Economic growth must mean something at the dinner table. It must mean education for our children, a job for a young graduate, a market for a farmer, capital for an entrepreneur, opportunity for a woman in business and a better future for every child.

Investing in Our People

Fellow citizens, we will scale up investment in education, skills development and healthcare.

Education remains the greatest equaliser, the best investment and inheritance we can give our children.

We will deepen the economic empowerment of women and young people and continue to strengthen social protection for those who need it most.

We will strengthen and accelerate decentralisation, putting more responsibility and resources in the hands of local communities.

Development will continue to reach every corner of our Republic.

No province will be excluded and no district will be forgotten. No community will ever feel that they do not matter.

A Change of Mindset

Fellow citizens, we are emerging from an era that taught many of our people to think only of today, and not of tomorrow — the tantameni, or handouts syndrome.

This culture was ingrained over many years, and it cannot be undone overnight.

As a nation, we have to think differently. We have to think of tomorrow, and not only of today.

We have to think of our children, our young people, and the generations to come.

A Public Service That Serves

Fellow citizens, we will continue to transform the public service into an effective, efficient, and delivery-oriented institution.

We want a public service that delivers quality services to every citizen, and supports the growth of the private sector and investment.

We will continue to strengthen accountability, professionalism and innovation, and ensure that public resources are managed prudently and used for the benefit of our people.

The fight against corruption will intensify. Public resources will be protected. Every public servant should put the national interest first, above their personal interest. When we all put national interests first, our personal interests will be taken care of.

Zambia in the Community of Nations

Your Excellencies, Zambia will continue to play an active, principled and constructive role in the community of nations.

Our foreign policy will remain anchored on economic diplomacy, peace, security, stability and mutually beneficial cooperation.

We have always said, "instability anywhere is instability everywhere."

Zambia remains a peaceful sovereign nation and we will continue to stand with our neighbours, our region Africa, and indeed the global community in pursuit of lasting peace.

We will remain an attractive investor-friendly country, a reliable partner, and a destination of choice for tourists, investors and global partners.

Zambia will continue to be a voice for peace, dialogue and cooperation.

One Zambia, One Nation, One People

Fellow citizens, we are here to serve all the people of Zambia, regardless of political affiliation, region, ethnicity, religion, gender or social status.

We therefore invite every citizen to join in the work of building our country.

Let us dedicate ourselves to hard and smart work.

Hard and smart work for sustained economic growth, for more jobs and business opportunities.

Hard and smart work for accessible, quality healthcare, education and social services.

Hard and smart work for a more united, peaceful, inclusive and prosperous Zambia.

Above all, let us remain One Zambia, One Nation, One People.

This is the promise at the heart of the Grow Zambia agenda.

But it should never reach the point where it becomes a matter between life and death. Life is sacred.

Where you have good ideas, we will listen. Where you offer constructive criticism, we will hear you. Where the national interest calls upon us to work together, we should do so.
